

## The Details

One person acts as a “wagonmaster” for the group. That person does the following:

- Makes all reservations (and changes to reservations) for the group through Reservations Northwest
- Pays fees to confirm reservation (first night fee for each site reserved)
- After the reservation is confirmed, the wagonmaster receives an information packet from the park
- Assigns sites to the campers in his group
- Returns site assignment form (included in the information packet) by regular mail, fax or email to the park at least 3 days before the reservation arrival date (in case of early arrivals)
- Arrives at the park first and checks in with the booth, then posts signs directing group to sites
- Delivers final list of campers in sites to booth by 9 a.m. on the day following arrival
- Pays all remaining charges for group by 9 a.m. on the day following arrival
- Coordinates payment of any extra charges such as for extra vehicles

# Club Camping

## Big Savings for Group Reservations



# Save Big!

## How It Works

If you camp as a group at one of our reservable parks you can save big money. If you reserve a group of sites together—at least 10 in summer and 5 in winter—your reservation fees will be waived. At \$6 per site, that's a hefty savings.



### Sites

All RV and tent sites are eligible. Specialty sites (yurts and similar structures) are not.

## If Your Group Drops Below The Minimum Number

Any club camping group that drops below the minimum number of sites will be assessed a \$30 charge upon arrival at the park. This will be charged to the wagonmaster. The minimum number of reserved sites is 10 in summer (May 1–September 30) and five in Discovery Season (October 1–April 30).

Individuals within the group do not have to arrive and depart on the same dates, but they must be together at least one night to qualify for the discount. Groups may not necessarily be clustered together.



## If You Cancel

If you cancel within 48 hours of your scheduled arrival, the wagonmaster will be charged a \$3.00 non-refundable cancellation fee per site, *provided that the minimum number of sites in your group is still met*. If it is not, one \$30 fee will apply to the wagonmaster.

If you cancel or move your reservation before that 48 hours, there is no fee, unless you drop below the minimum number of sites. Any reservation resulting in full cancellation will be charged the \$30 fee.



## Discovery Season Discounts

Discovery Season brings big savings, too. From October 1–April 30, campsites are discounted up to \$4 per night. And, if you reserve 5 sites or more during Discovery Season, you receive a free group meeting hall for one day (if available; see list on other side).

## Another Cool Bonus

If you're a club camper, your reservation gives you the option of one free day's use of a meeting hall. Great for reunions, potlucks, you name it. No deposit necessary, but you must reserve with Reservations Northwest. Meeting hall use is subject to availability. Of course, you are welcome to book the meeting hall for longer than one day, subject to the usual rental fee, but the reservation fee will be waived.
