

# KAYAK DEVIL'S LAKE



Lincoln City, OR— Come with us and learn the history and ecology of Devil's Lake on a guided kayak tour. Tours begin Memorial Day weekend and run through Labor Day weekend. View the wildlife, aquatic plants, and waterfowl that call Devil's Lake home as you glide through the natural wetlands of this coastal lake. The tours launch from a primitive boat ramp at NE 1st street where public parking is available. After a quick orientation you will enjoy paddling along the southwestern wetlands of Devil's Lake. **Tours run Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday launching at 7:30am and returning to shore around 10am.** Basic equipment is provided including; life vests, kayaks, paddles, and binoculars. Suggested things to bring would be; water bottle, camera, sunscreen, weather appropriate clothing, and a hat. The tours are guided by knowledgeable volunteers. *Check with booth staff for more information.*

## DEVIL'S LAKE STATE PARK

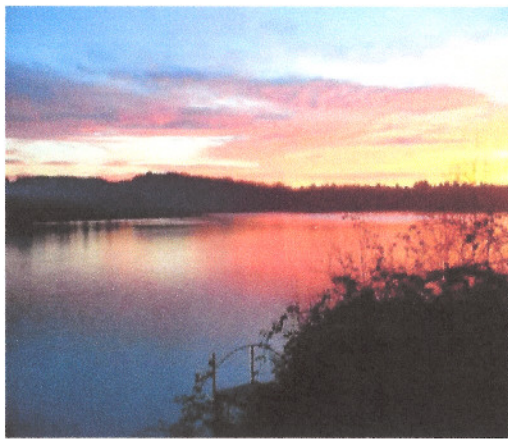
The lake is beautiful and calm in the morning with few waves and little wind. This is a perfect chance for beginning kayakers to see the exceptional wetland areas of Devil's Lake.



**The cost is \$15 per adult and \$10 for children 6-14**, to participate you must be at least 18 years of age or accompanied by an adult. Children 6-14 must ride with an adult or guardian in a double kayak. **Children under 6 years of age are not permitted on the tour.** **Payment must be made prior to the day of the tour.** Fees can be paid over the phone with a credit card or at the campground booth. A waiver must also be signed, before starting the tour.

### **Directions:**

*From the campground registration booth:*

**If walking:** Just access our nature trail/boardwalk up by registration booth and it will lead you right to 1st street.

**If driving:** Take a left out of the campground. Take a left on Hwy 101 at the traffic light. Drive about a 1/4 mile south to NE 1st street. Take a left onto NE 1st street.

### **From D-River State Wayside**

Take a left out of the wayside. Take the first right after the bridge onto NE 1st street.
