



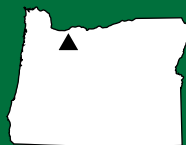

Reserve early! Reserve campsites and group areas two days to nine months in advance by phone: Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687). Campsites are also reservable through www.oregonstateparks.org.

Milo McIver State Park offers seasonal camping and other year-round recreation ranging from horseback riding to disc golf along the scenic Clackamas River.

Seasonal Camping

(Open mid-March–October)

- 44 electrical sites with water
- 9 tent sites with water nearby
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Hot showers and flush toilets
- 3 group tent camping areas with water, flush toilets and fire rings
- Hiker/biker camp
- RV dump station (just past registration booth; please do not dump sewer waste into the waste water basins in this campground.)

Universal Access

1 campsite (A10) is accessible to campers with disabilities.

Discovery Season

From October 1–April 30, camping in an Oregon state park costs less. At Milo McIver, you can save \$4 per night off summer rates on electrical sites from mid-March through April 30, and again during October.

Enjoy the View

Enjoy views of the river, lush forests, pastoral grassy areas and three prominent Cascade peaks: Oregon's Mt. Hood, and Washington's Mount St. Helens and Mt. Adams.

The park includes 951 acres of lawns and wooded areas on natural terraces above the Clackamas River. A memorial viewpoint near the entrance honors Milo K. McIver, an Oregon State Highway Commissioner from 1950 to 1962.

Year-round Day-use Fun

Milo McIver State Park has two inviting day-use areas open year round. **Riverbend** day-use area has rolling grass meadows accented by maple and Douglas-fir trees. Here you will find trails, picnic shelters, restrooms, a 27-hole disc golf course and a primitive boat launch. Picnic tables are located near each of the major parking areas. Several group picnic areas include shelters that accommodate large groups. The shelters are reservable through Reservations Northwest, 1-800-452-5687.

Riverside day-use area has picnic tables, a group picnic area, a boating/rafting access ramp, a large parking area and an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife fish hatchery. The hatchery raises and releases more than a million Chinook salmon each year. The group picnic area, located near the hatchery, accommodates 200 people.

Day-use area parking permits are required at all times in both of the park's day-use areas. You can buy a daily permit at the park's entrance booth, or purchase 12- and 24-month permits at major state park offices, including the Milo McIver office. Your camping receipt also is equal to a daily permit for those days registered.

By Foot, Bike or Horseback

Seven miles of hiking and horseback trails meander from the Riverside day-use area through meadows and forested hillsides. A nature trail is part of a six-mile trail network in the northern day-use area.

Play it Safe

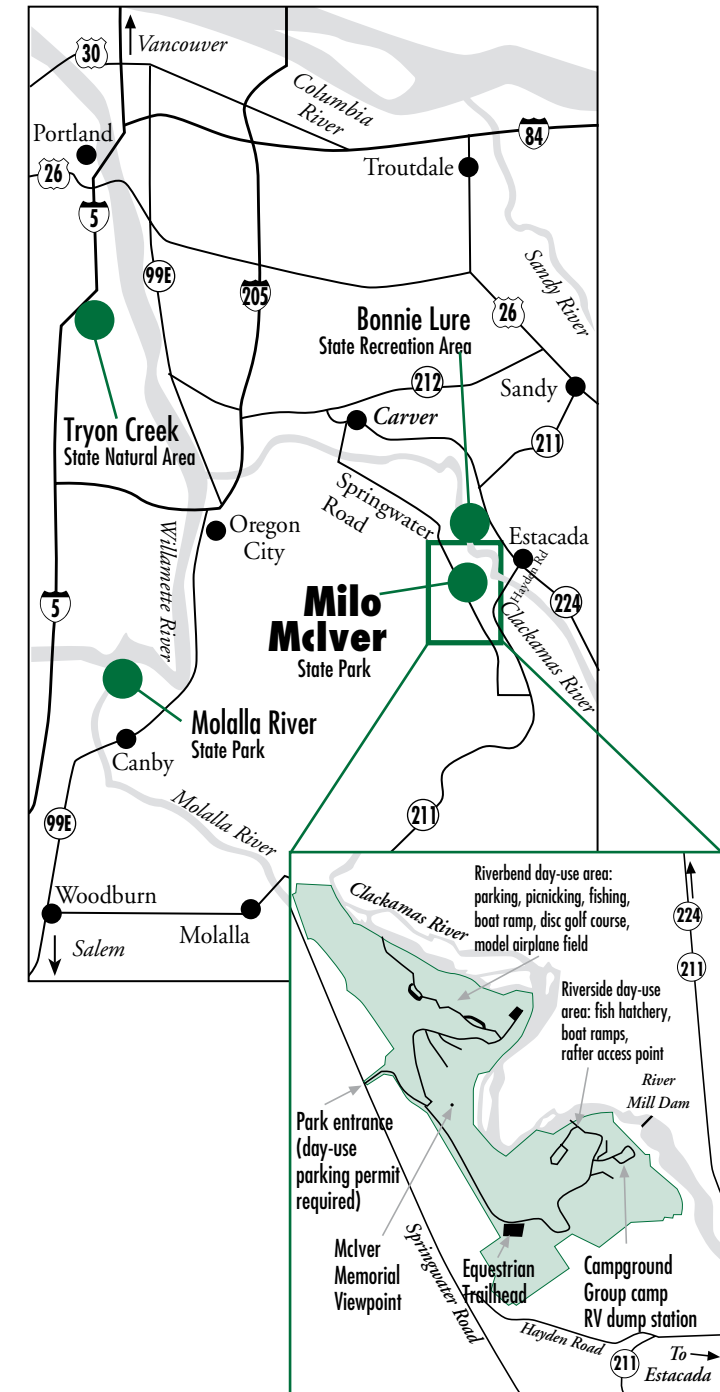
The park has many access points to the Clackamas River. Do not try to navigate the river unless you have the proper equipment and skill. The river's current is swift and treacherous. Always wear a life jacket.

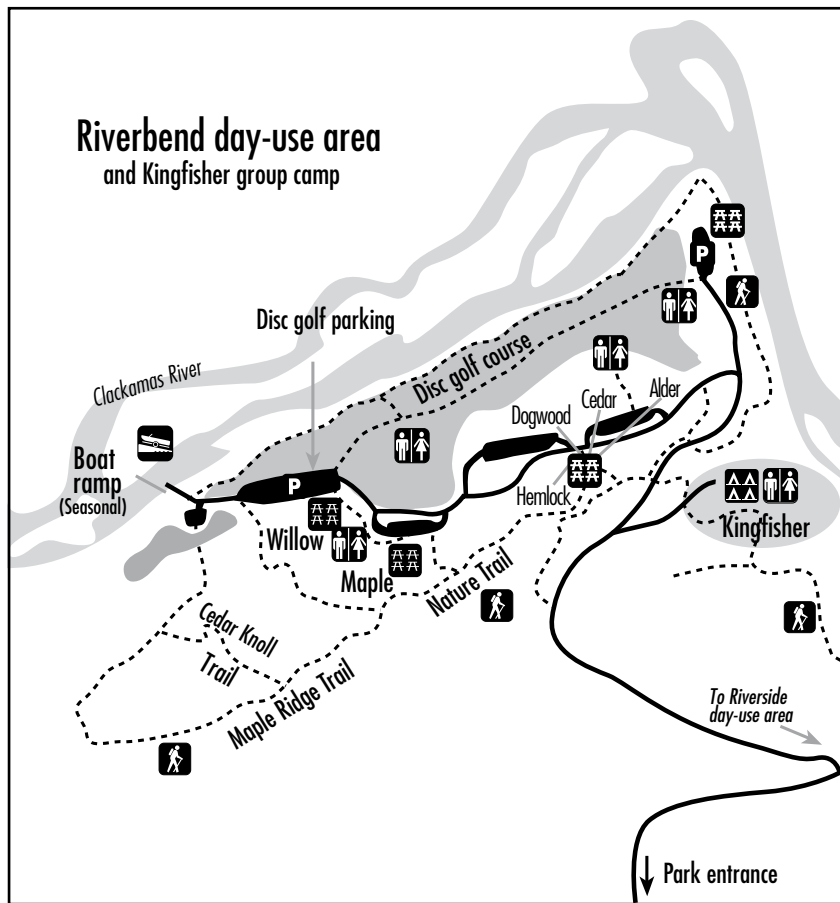

Please help make camping here a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved areas only.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads only, but ride with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m. (14-night stay limit.)

Note: For security, the campground gate is closed from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.



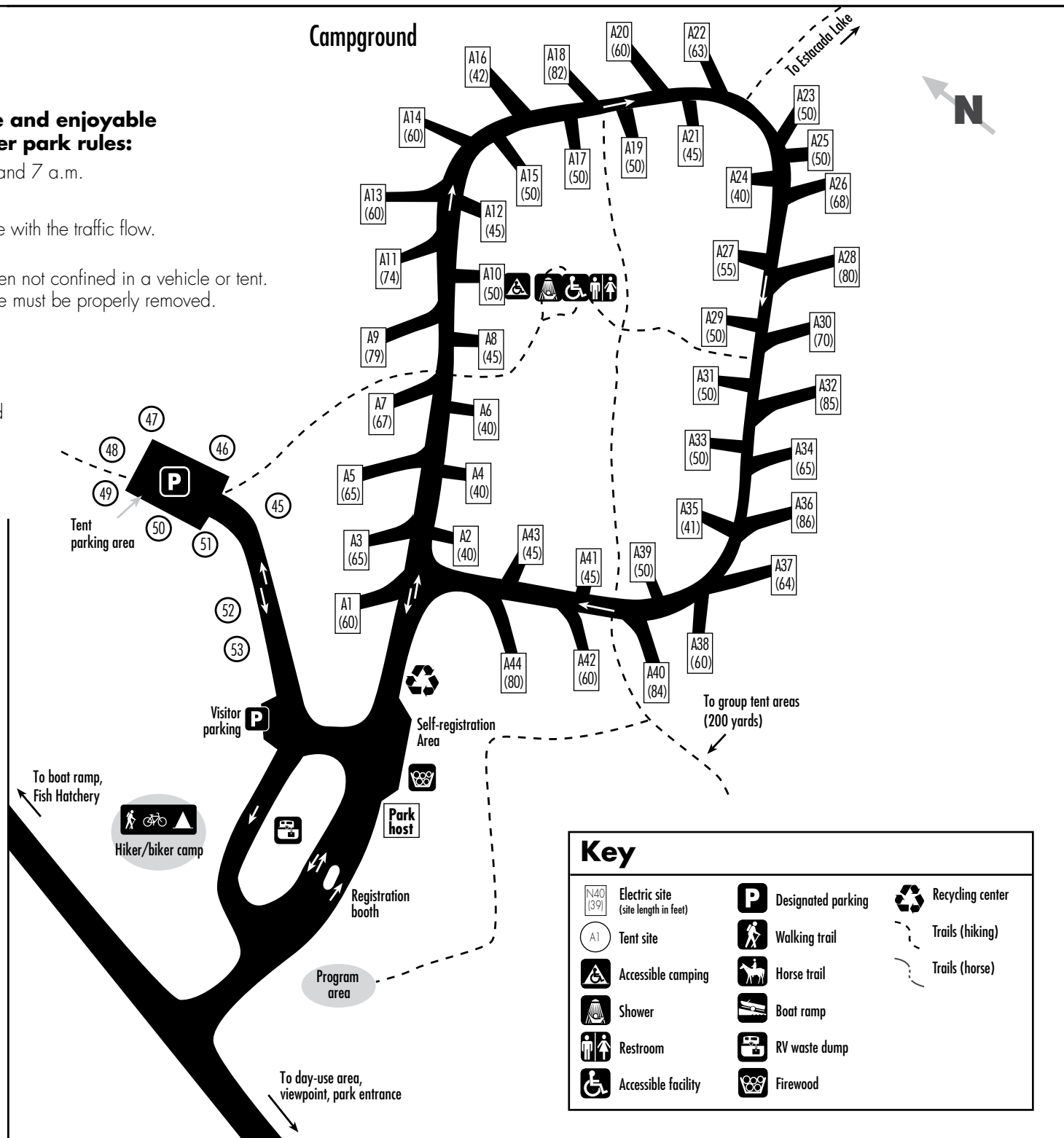
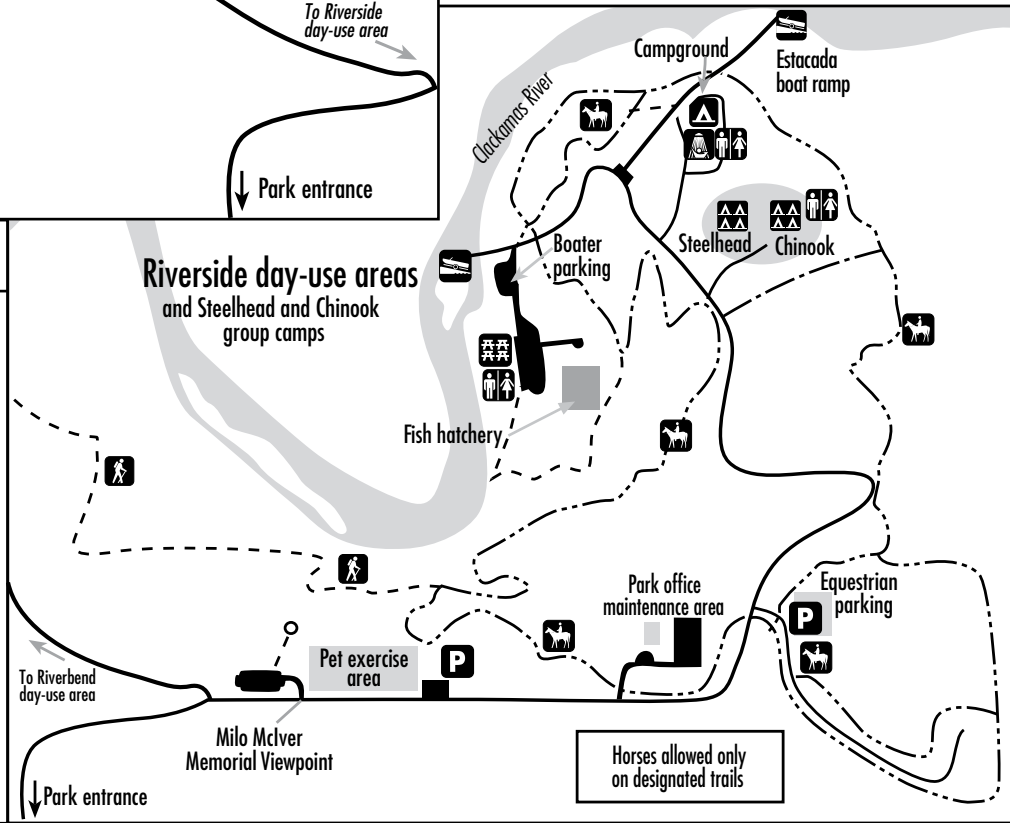
Key
