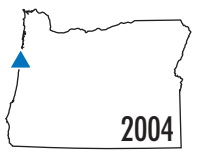

Yurts!

Enjoy the year-round comforts of a domed tent with structural support, a plywood floor, lockable wooden door, lights and heating, and beds with mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three, and a fold-out couch sleeps two. A large deck, camp stove, picnic table and parking are right outside.

Discover the Difference

From October 1-April 30, camping in an Oregon state park is a whole new world of outdoor fun. It costs less, too. Campsites are \$4 less per night. Ask for a list of Discovery Season rates or call 1-800-551-6949.

Explore Park Trails

Cooper Ridge Nature Trail: Keep your eyes and ears open while you follow this 1.75-mile trail around the edge of the campground (see map). Please do not wander from the trail or disturb vegetation.

South Jetty Trail: This paved, 10-foot-wide accessible pedestrian/bicycle path is a one-mile link between the park's day-use area and South Jetty Road. Trails from the campground also connect with the trail. The South Jetty Road offers pedestrian access to attractions on the south shore of Yaquina Bay.

Old Jetty Trail: This lightly-traveled one-mile nature trail leads from the day-use parking area to the South Jetty. It passes through a shore pine forest over dunes covered with European and American beach grass. Be alert for wildlife.

Take a Kayak Tour

Ask about guided kayak tours on nearby Beaver Creek. The seasonal two-hour trips launch at Ona Beach State Recreation Site, five miles south of South Beach. Beaver Creek winds through coastal wetland inhabited by a variety of wildlife. The number of people who register and the availability of guides determine tour schedules. The fee is \$15 per person. We supply the kayaks.

Visit That Lighthouse

From the south jetty, you can see historic Yaquina Bay Lighthouse, the centerpiece of Yaquina Bay State Recreation Site. It's open all year round, weather permitting.

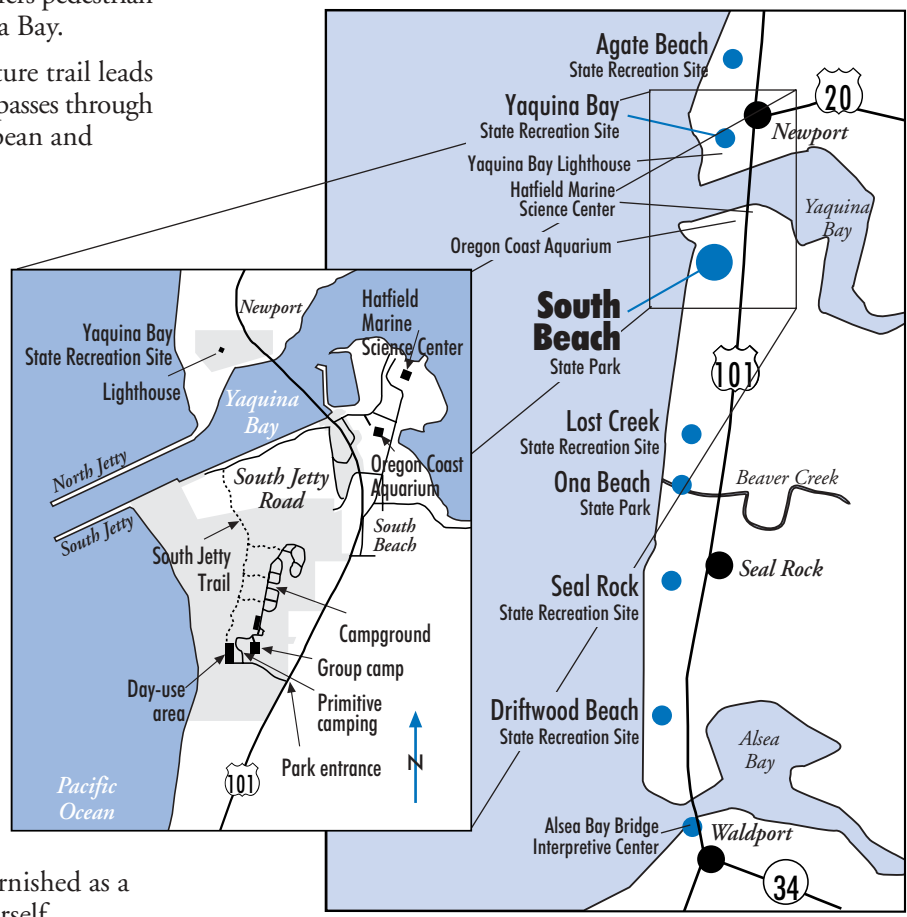
The lighthouse is a unique structure that combined the lightkeeper's quarters and the light tower in the same building. Built in 1871, it was in service only until 1874, when the Yaquina Head Lighthouse was commissioned three miles north of Newport. The facility has been restored and furnished as a museum. Some say it's haunted. Find out for yourself.

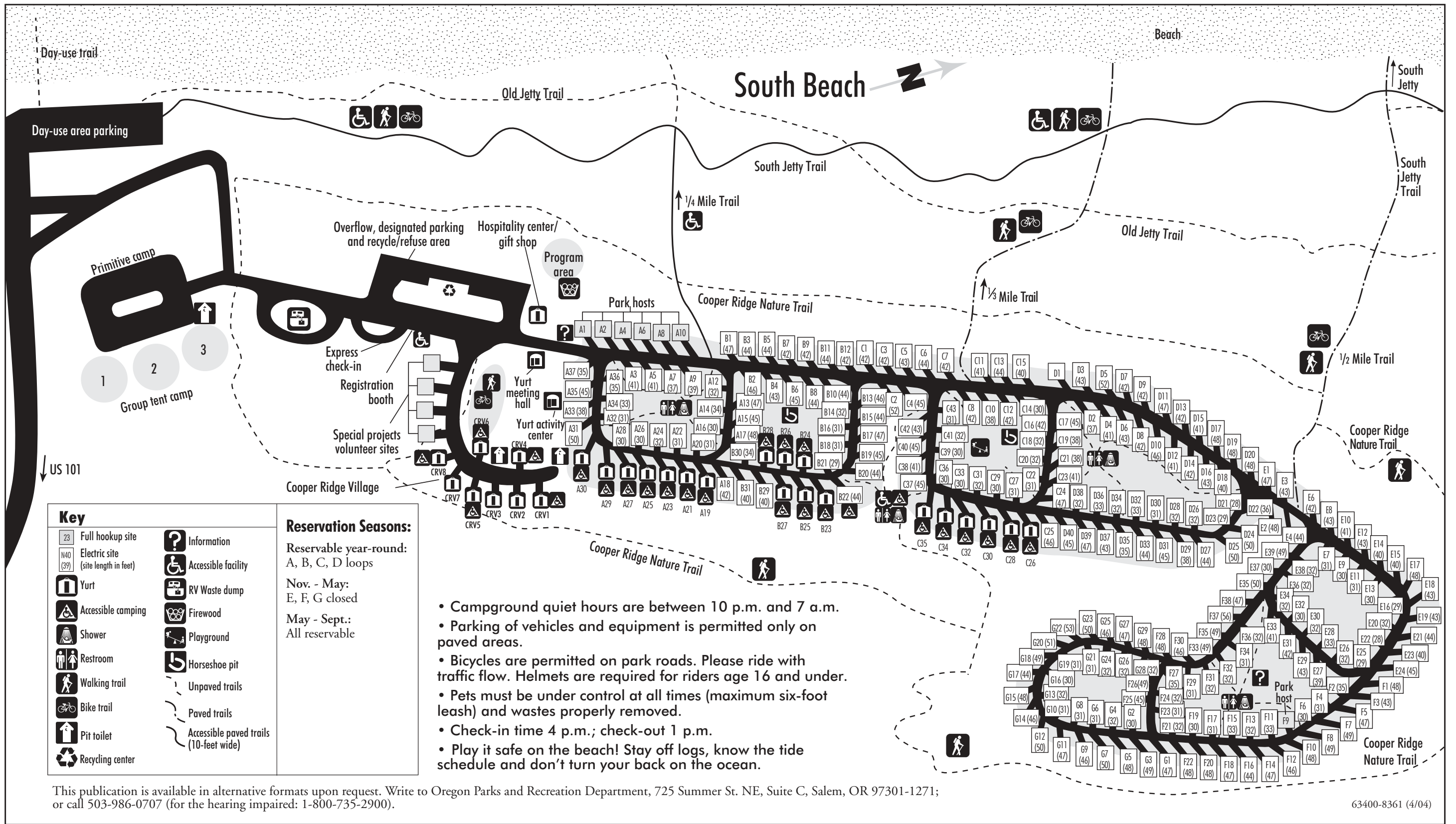
If That's Not Enough . . .

Fishing, Crabbing and Clamming. On the Newport bayfront and Yaquina Bay just north of the park, fishing, clamming and crabbing are popular. Charter boats, launching and moorage facilities, and other equipment rentals are available.

Oregon Coast Aquarium. See the marine creatures and exhibits that showcase the beauty and diversity of sea life along the Oregon coast. The aquarium is within walking distance of the park.

Mark O. Hatfield Marine Science Center. Learn about Oregon's coastal environment and marine life from exhibits and research provided by Oregon State University marine sciences experts.

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Parking of vehicles and equipment is permitted only on paved areas.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads. Please ride with traffic flow. Helmets are required for riders age 16 and under.
- Pets must be under control at all times (maximum six-foot leash) and wastes properly removed.
- Check-in time 4 p.m.; check-out 1 p.m.
- Play it safe on the beach! Stay off logs, know the tide schedule and don't turn your back on the ocean.
