Stub Stewart State Park has a forested hillside assortment of camping experiences and trails to explore less than an hour west of Portland.

Dairy Creek Camp West

(Full hookup sites 2-17, walk-in sites 18-29 open year round)

- 43 full hookup sites (sewer, 50 amp electricity, water)
- 12 walk-in tent sites, water nearby
- Universal access parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- Meeting hall

Dairy Creek Camp East

(Open mid-March–October)

- 35 full hookup sites (sewer, 50 amp electricity, water)
- Universal access parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- Playground
- Disc golf area (3 holes between east, west camps)

Hares Canyon Horse Camp

(Open March 1–October 31)

- 14 full hookup sites with 4-stall corrals
- 2 double-size full hookup sites with 6-stall corrals
- Universal access parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Manure bins
- Flush toilets and hot showers

Note: All RV hookup sites are 50-foot long.

Brooke Creek Hike-in Camp

(Open year round)

- 23 primitive campsites with water nearby
- Picnic table at each site
- 2 common areas with fire rings
- 2 vault toilets (access to flush toilets and hot showers)

Mountain Dale Cabin Village

A forest-filled panorama with a skyline dominated by the Coast mountain range are an eye full west of the Mountain Dale Cabin Village. The village has 15 cabins—three with two rooms that sleep up to five people, and 12 one-room cabins that also sleep up to five. Amenities for each cabin includes electricity, heating, beds with mattresses (futon double and twin/bunk), tables and chairs. A shower-restroom building and a meeting hall with a kitchen and restrooms also are part of the complex.

Universal Access

Dairy Creek Camp West sites 11, 13 and 30, and Dairy Creek Camp East sites 68 and 69 are accessible to campers with disabilities. All cabins except numbers 2 and 3 are ADA accessible.

Day-use Amenities and Fees

The Hilltop Day-use Area is another great place to enjoy the grand view westward or to start exploring the trail system. A picnic shelter (first-come, first-served) is there for group functions. An off-leash area for pets is at the north end. An 18-hole mountain-style disc golf course lies among the trees just east of the day-use area.

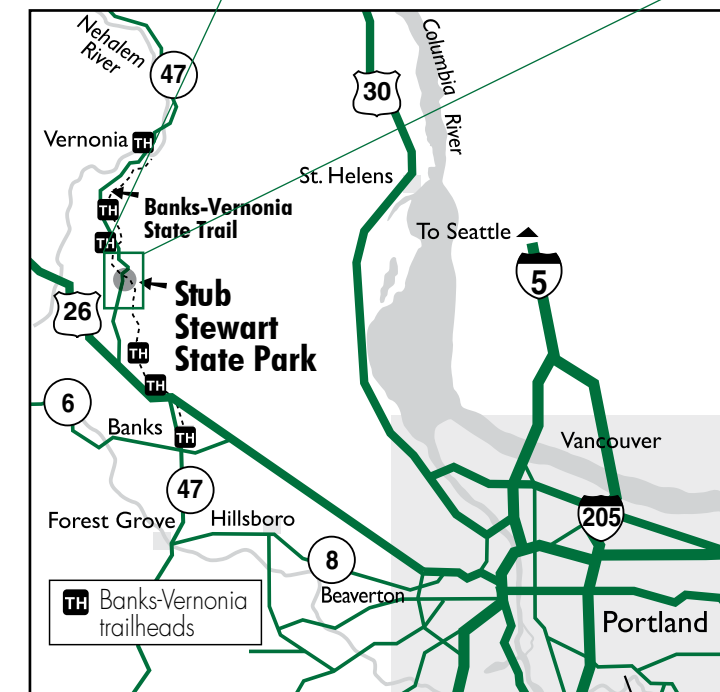
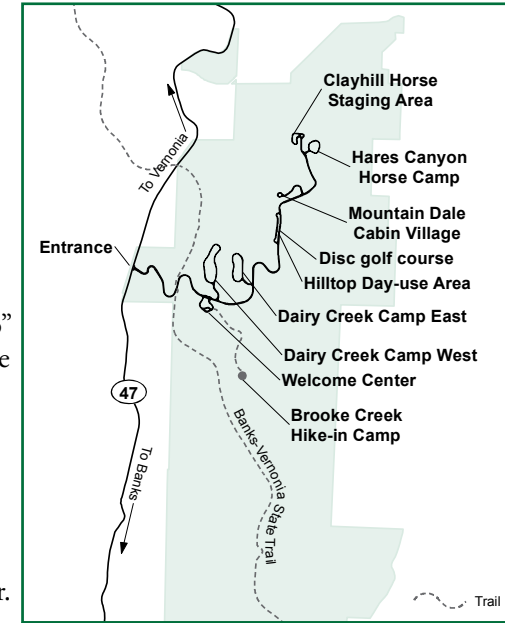
Day-use permits are required in the park all year. You can buy a daily permit at the day-use area registration station, or purchase 12- or 24-month permits at the welcome center registration window. Your camping receipt also is equal to a daily permit for those days registered if displayed on the driver side of your vehicle.

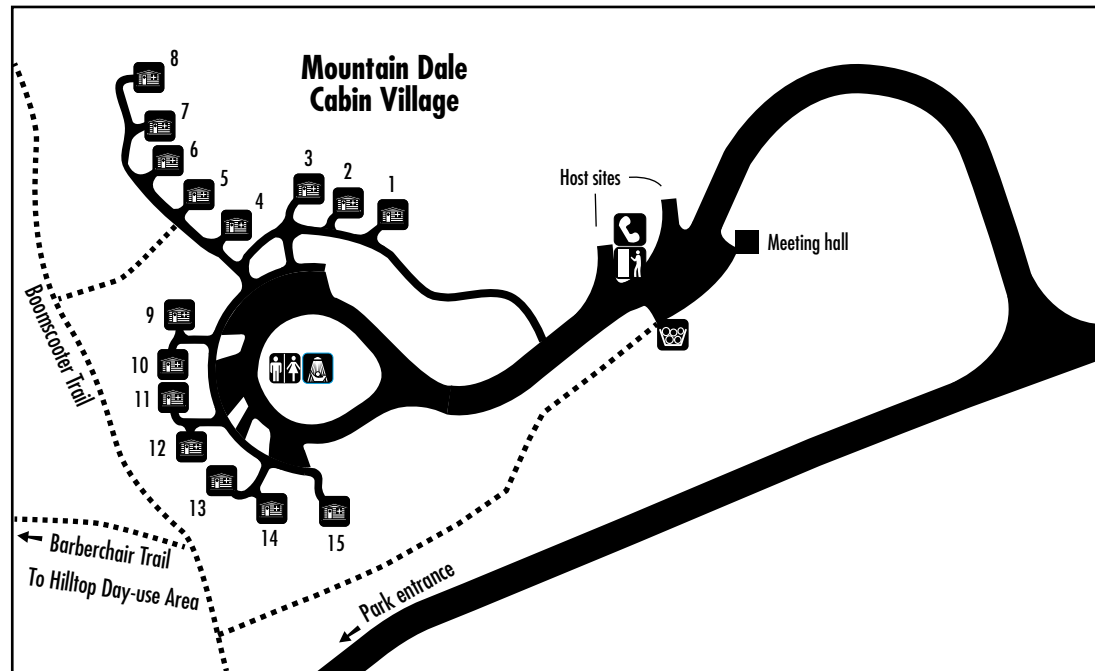
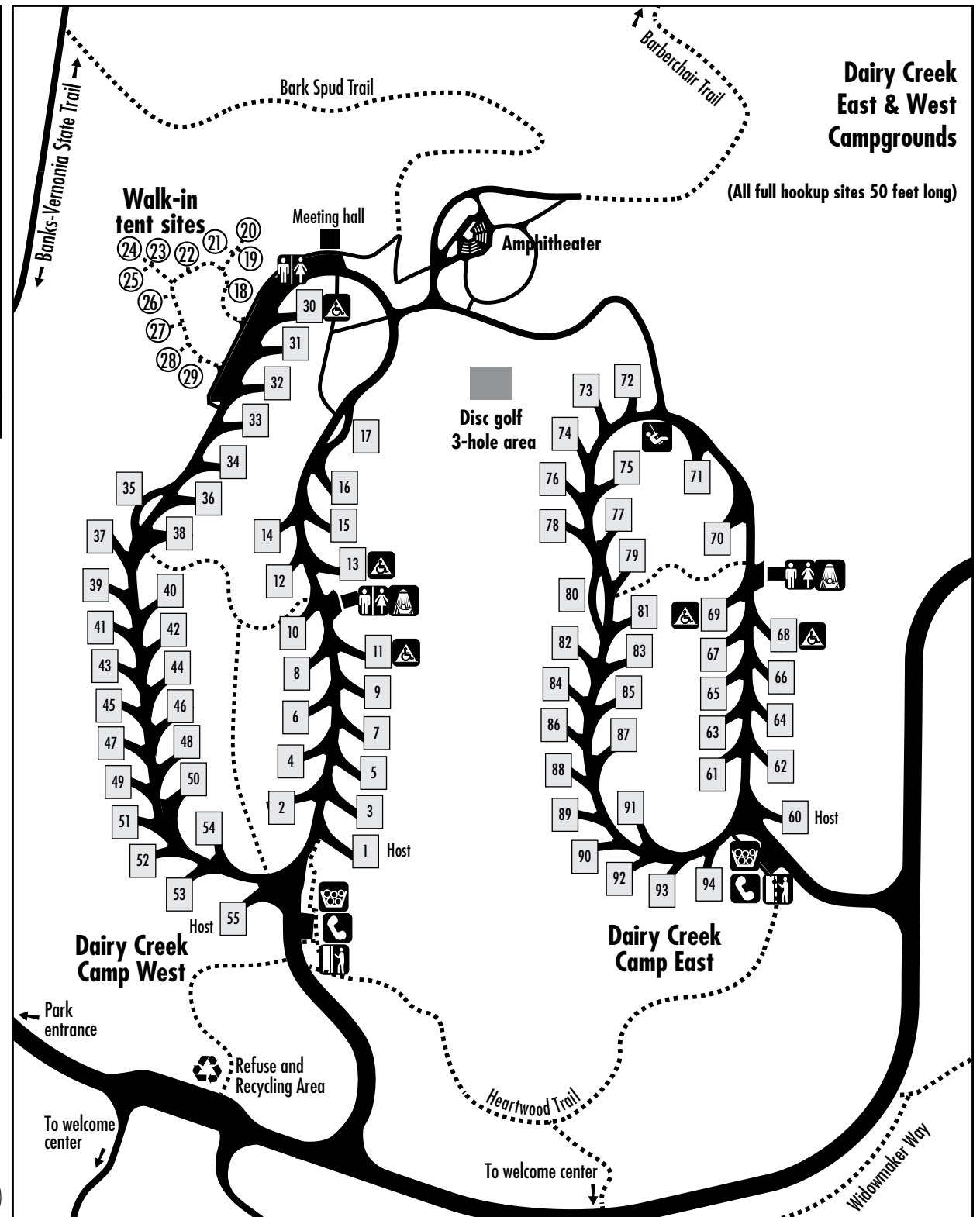
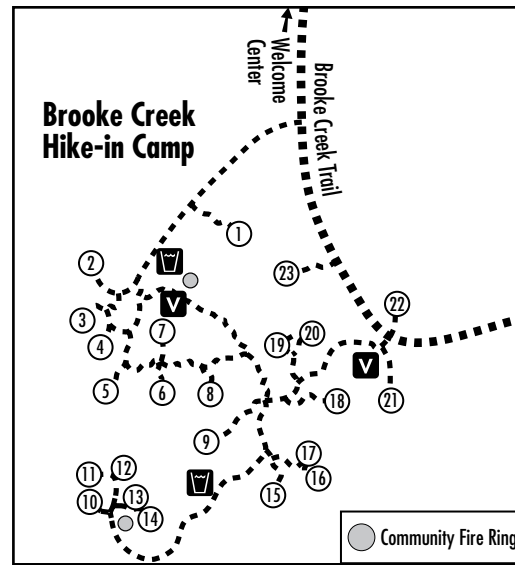
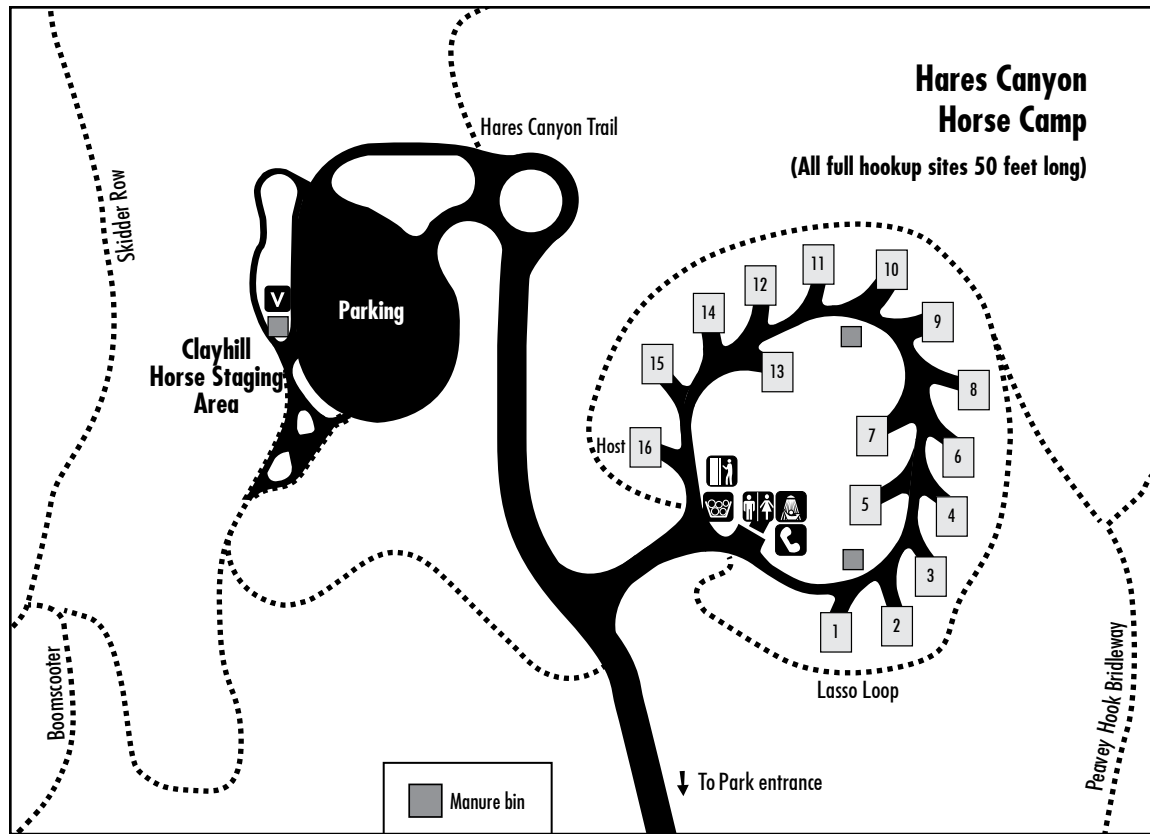
Trails, Trails and More Trails

With more than 20 miles of multi-purpose trails, the park is a premier destination for hikers, bicyclists and horseback riders. Many of the trails have names recalling the area's timber history. Some connect with the 21-mile-long Banks-Vernonia State Trails, 3½ miles of which bisect the park on a north-south route.

Discovery Depot

Trail maps are available along with nature and recreation guidebooks, postcards and other nature-oriented items at the Discovery Depot in the park's L.L. "Stub" Stewart Welcome Center. Depot hours are 11 a.m.–4 p.m., Wednesday–Sunday, from mid-March through October.

Please help make camping here a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved areas only.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but ride them with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)
