Reserve early! Reserve campsites, yurts and cabins two days to nine months in advance by phone, Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687), or online through www.oregonstateparks.org.

William M. Tugman state park has year-round camping, a scenic freshwater lake, and the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area right next door.

Year-Round Camping

- 94 electrical sites with water
- 16 yurts (2 pet friendly)
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire rings at all sites
- Hot showers and flush toilets
- Hiker/biker camp
- RV dump station

Universal Access

2 campsites (B28, B30) and 8 yurts are accessible to campers with disabilities.

Discovery Season

From October 1 - April 30, you can rent full, electric or tent sites for less. At most state parks, including William M. Tugman, you can save \$4 off summer rates.

Yurts!

A yurt is a domed tent with structural support, a wood floor and a lockable wooden door. It has lights, heating, and beds with vinyl covered mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three and a futon couch sleeps two. A fire ring, picnic table and paved parking are right outside. Maximum 2 pets (cats and/or dogs only) in the pet friendly facilities; donations accepted.

Room to Play

Tugman's day-use area features broad green lawns with plenty of space for groups. Open space surrounds a gazebo-style reservable picnic shelter, perfect for family reunions.

Eel Lake

Blue, forest-ringed Eel Lake is one of a chain of freshwater jewels just east of the coastline. Its waters are perfect for fishing, swimming, canoeing, sailing and boating (10 m.p.h. speed limit).

Park facilities include a boat ramp and fishing dock modified for use by anglers with disabilities. Fish for bass and rainbow trout from the dock or a boat. The lake also has crappie, steelhead, and catch-and-release coho salmon.

A trail around the south end of the lake allows hikers to explore the lake's many inlets. Look for osprey, crane, eagle, deer and other forest animals as you walk through stands of spruce, cedar, fir, and alder.

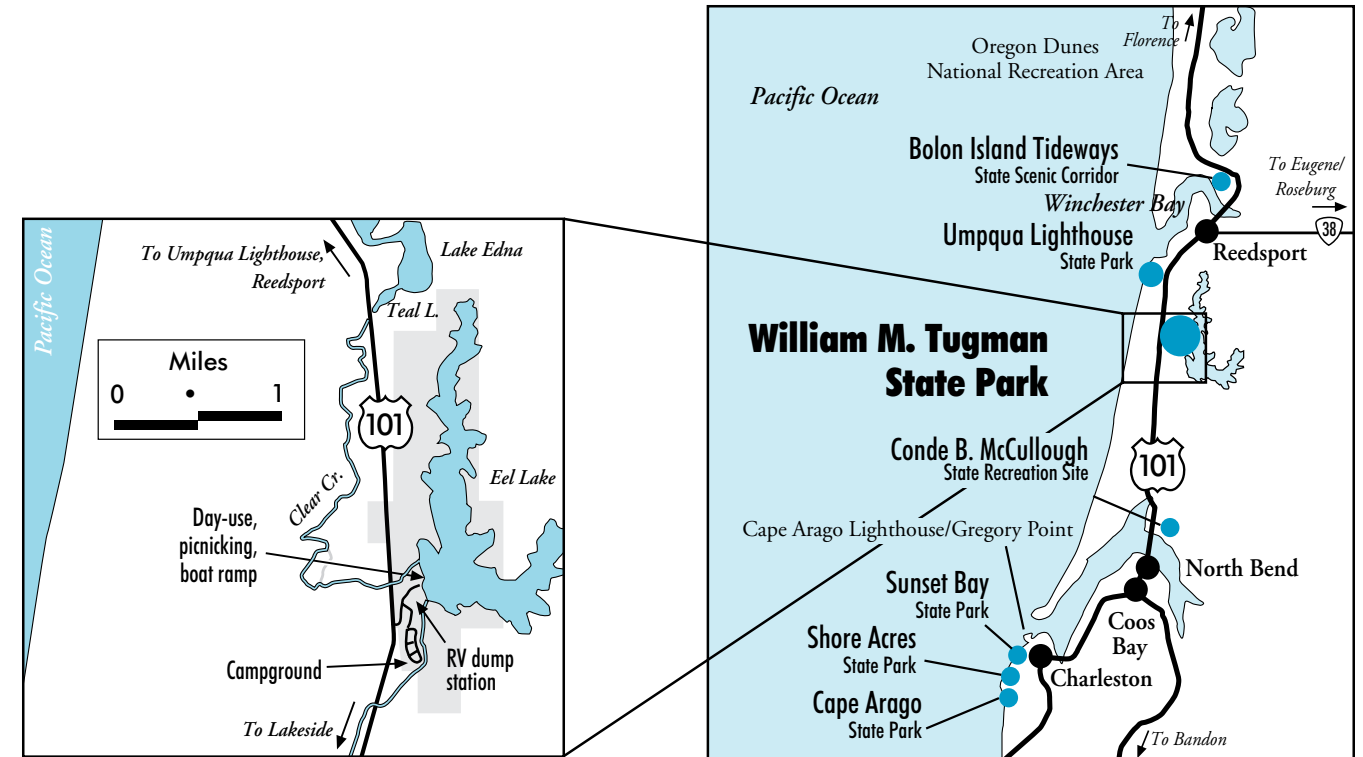

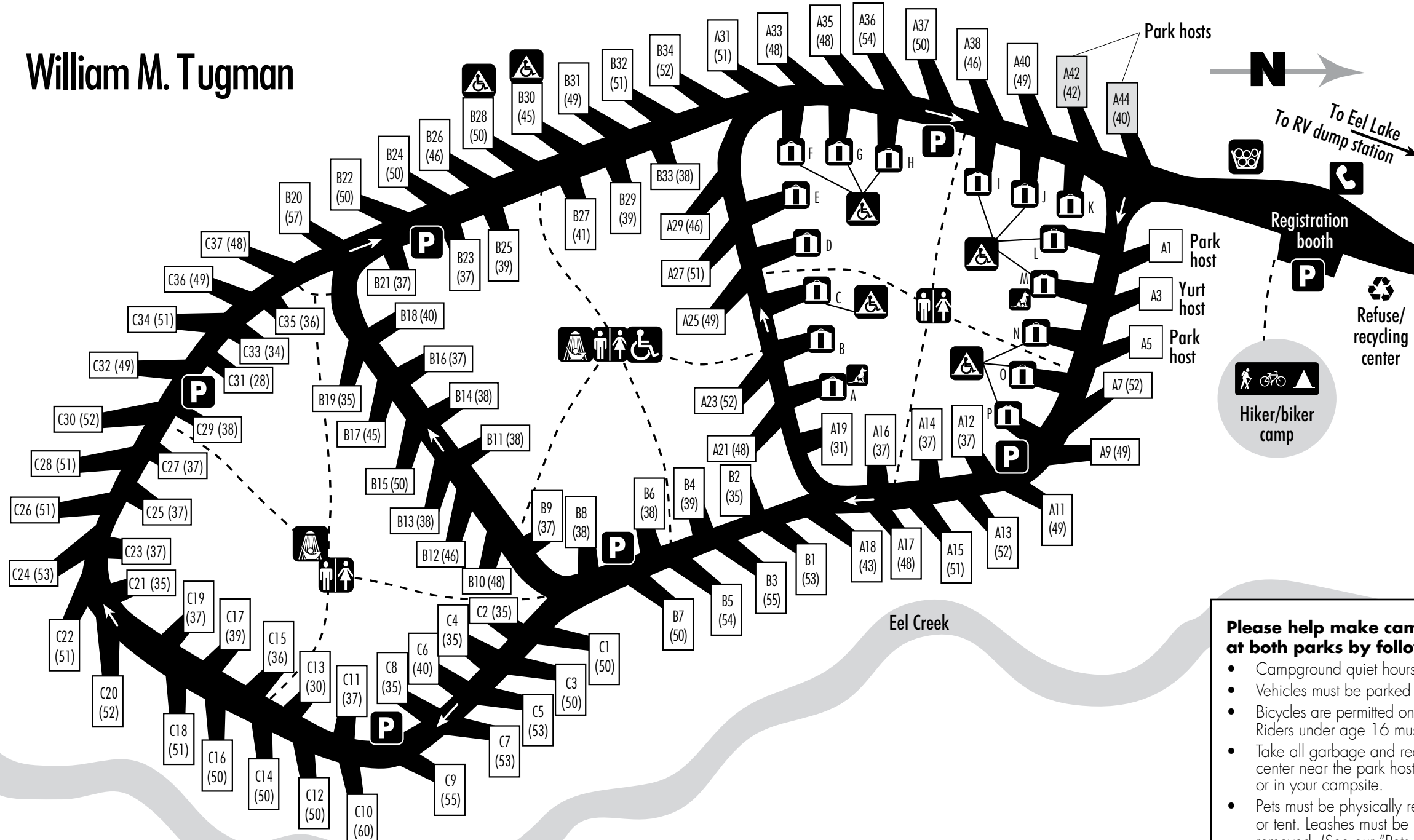
What's Nearby

Winchester Bay offers year round crabbing, fishing, whale watching, golfing, shopping and dining opportunities. It is also the home of the Umpqua River lighthouse and lighthouse museum.

Umpqua River Lighthouse was the first lighthouse commissioned on the Oregon Coast. Originally built on the north spit of the Umpqua River in 1857, it was destroyed in 1861 when it fell into the river following a severe storm. Today's lighthouse, with a 65-foot tower, sits on the south side of Winchester bay. The lighthouse and a museum are maintained by Douglas County Parks and Recreation Department. Tours run May through September. Call 541-271-4631 for current schedules and information.

Please help make camping a safe and enjoyable experience at both parks by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved areas only.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but ride them with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Take all garbage and recyclable materials to our dumpsters and a recycling center near the park host sites. Do not leave garbage in restroom trash cans or in your campsite.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)
