*1 campsite (B11) and 1 yurt (B8) accessible to campers with disabilities (see map). NOTE: RV dump stations are located at LaPine State Park, 27 miles south of Bend, and The Cove Palisades State Park, 20 miles north of Redmond. Please use these stations to dump a full holding tank instead of a campsite connection, which may overflow.

Yurts!

Enjoy the year-round comforts of a domed tent with structural support, a plywood floor, a lockable wooden door, lights and heating, and beds with mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three, and a fold-out couch sleeps two. A fire ring, picnic table and paved parking are right outside.

Picnic Along the River

Tumalo's day-use area, features picnic sites shaded by large Ponderosa pines, junipers and alders along the river. Two group picnic areas are reservable through Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687). Fishing for German brown and rainbow trout in the Deschutes River is especially good during the spring and late summer. A swimming area is located at the far end of the trail through the picnic area.

Day-Use Area Fees

Day-use passes are required year-round in the day-use area. Display a daily permit, a 12-month or 24-month pass, or your camping receipt on the driver side of your dashboard. Your camping receipt is equal to a daily permit for those days registered. You may purchase a daily permit for \$3 at the yellow vending machine located at the entrance. The 12-month (\$25) and 24-month (\$40) passes are sold at G.I. Joe's stores throughout Oregon and at major state park offices.

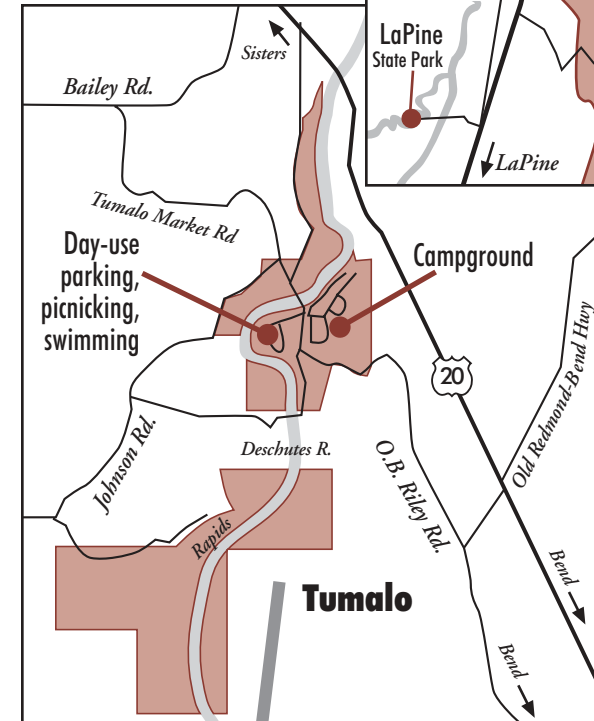
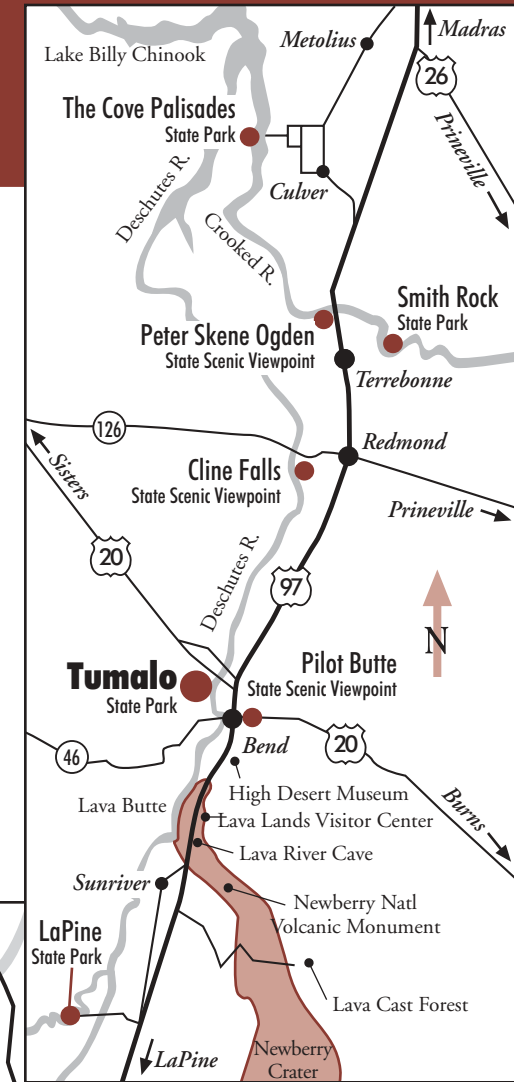
What's Nearby

Pilot Butte State Scenic Viewpoint (east of Bend) offers a spectacular view of central Oregon. You can drive to the summit, or hike up one of its trails.

Newberry National Monument, south of Bend, features:

- Newberry Crater, a five-mile-wide caldera containing two popular fishing lakes, obsidian fields, waterfalls and unique lava formations.
- Lava Lands Visitor Center, with interpretive exhibits and a viewpoint at the summit of Lava Butte.
- Lava Cast Forest, the world's largest formation of its kind.
- Lava River Cave, a lava tube accessed by a one-mile trail (summer only).

The **High Desert Museum**, just south of Bend, is an indoor/outdoor museum with trails and narrative explaining the flora and fauna of the high desert. Live animal displays include an otter pond, porcupine den, reptiles and raptors.

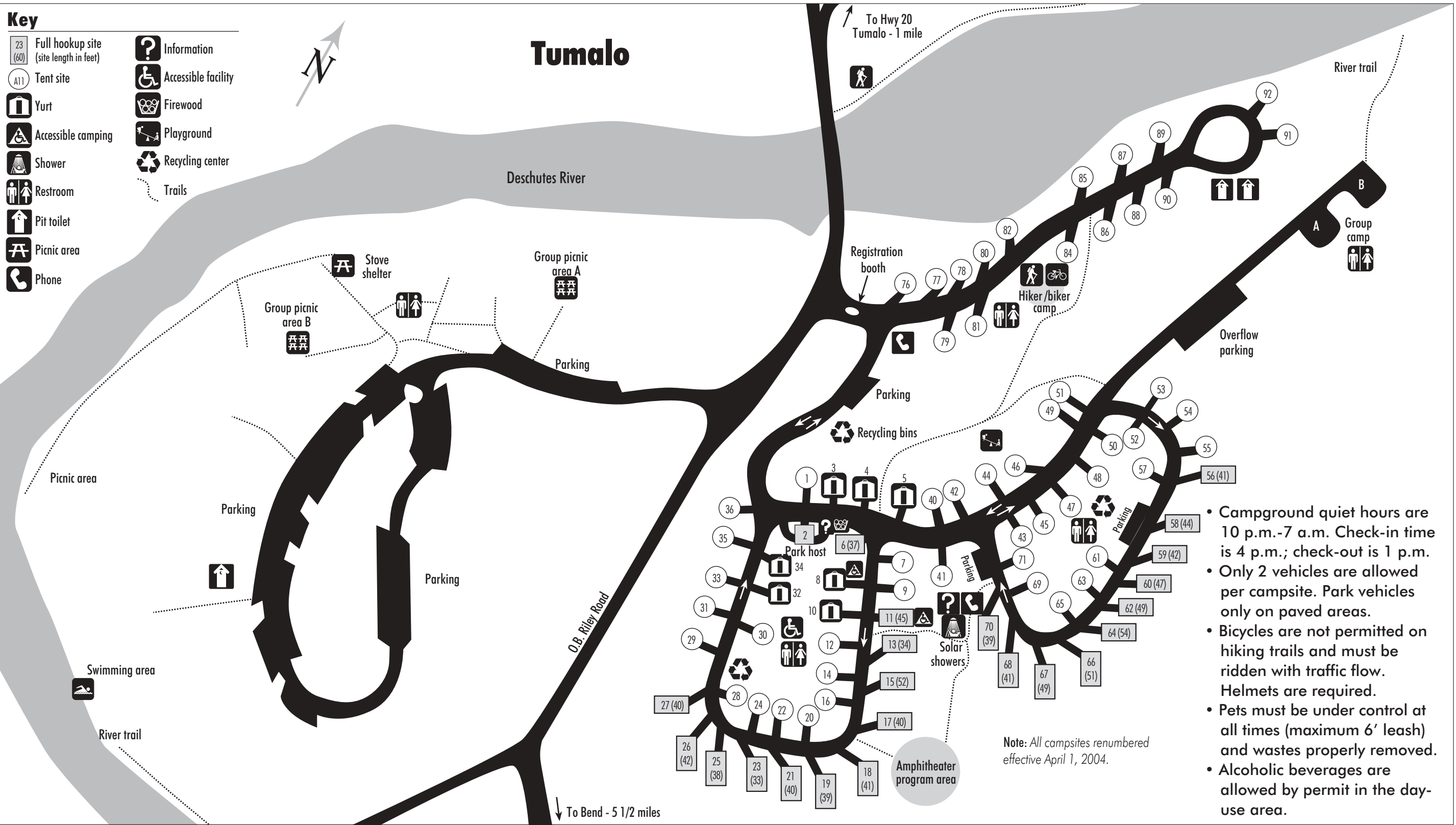

- Campground quiet hours are 10 p.m.-7 a.m. Check-in time is 4 p.m.; check-out is 1 p.m.
- Only 2 vehicles are allowed per campsite. Park vehicles only on paved areas.
- Bicycles are not permitted on hiking trails and must be ridden with traffic flow. Helmets are required.
- Pets must be under control at all times (maximum 6' leash) and wastes properly removed.
- Alcoholic beverages are allowed by permit in the day-use area.
