## CAMPGROUND

**Umpqua Lighthouse** state park has year-round camping, a scenic freshwater lake, and the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area surrounds the park.

### Year-Round Camping

- 12 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water)
- 8 electrical sites with water
- 23 tent sites with water nearby
- 2 rustic yurts
- 6 deluxe yurts (1 pet friendly)
- 2 rustic log cabins
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire rings at all sites
- Hot showers and flush toilets
- Hiker/biker camp

### Universal Access

1 deluxe yurt (16) is accessible to campers with disabilities.

### Discovery Season

From October 1 - April 30, you can rent full, electric or tent sites for less. At most state parks, including Umpqua Lighthouse, you can save \$4 off summer rates. Deluxe yurts are also discounted during the discovery season.

### Yurts!

A yurt is a domed tent with structural support, a wood floor and a lockable wooden door. It has lights, heating, and beds with vinyl covered mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three and a futon couch sleeps two. A fire ring, picnic table and paved parking are right outside.

### Deluxe Yurts

Umpqua Lighthouse is the only state park with deluxe yurts. They have a kitchen with refrigerator, microwave, and sink, as well a full bathroom with shower. A TV/DVD player is also available (no cable). The 24-foot diameter facility has sleeping for seven people. Maximum 2 pets (cats and or/dogs only) in the pet friendly facilities; donations accepted.

### Cabins

These one-room rustic cabins have heat, lights, a table with chairs and sleeping for 4 people. The deck outside overlooks Lake Marie.

### Lake Marie

Both the park's campground and day-use areas lie next to Lake Marie, a small, but picturesque body of water trapped by the dunes. The lake is open to canoeing and fishing. A small, sandy beach accommodates swimmers. A one-mile, self-guided nature trail circles the lake.

### Dunes North, Dunes South

The park is located in the center of the dunes of the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area, which stretches 47 miles from Florence south to Coos Bay. Hiking trails and areas set aside for off-road vehicles are nearby. Dune buggy rentals are

available in nearby Reedsport or Winchester Bay, or bring your own. The recreation area's information center is in Reedsport.

### Umpqua River Lighthouse

The first lighthouse on the Oregon coast was built on the north spit of the Umpqua River in 1857. However, it was destroyed in 1861 when it fell into the river after a severe storm.

The lighthouse now has a 65-foot tower and sits on a hill 100 feet above sea level on the south side of Winchester Bay. Its lens emits distinctive red and white automated flashes, the only colored signal on the Oregon Coast.

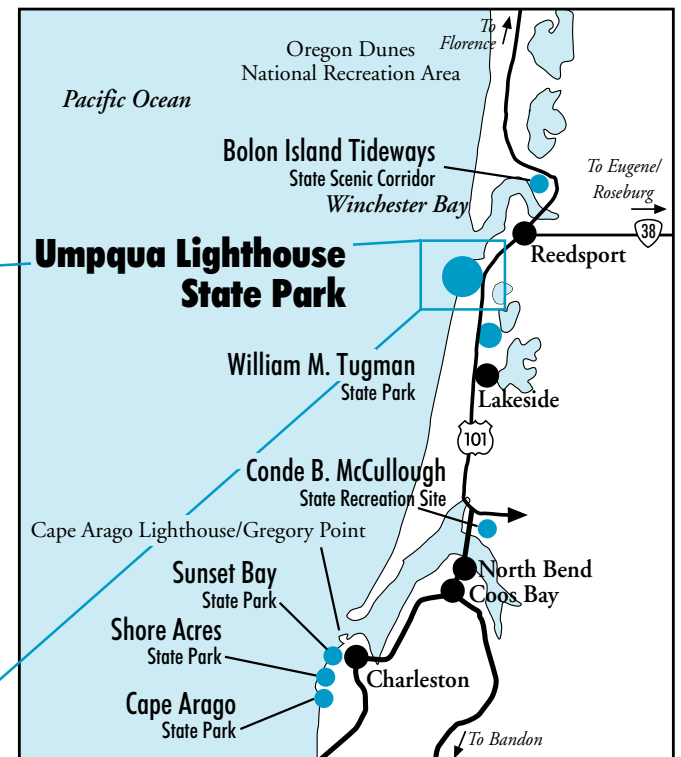
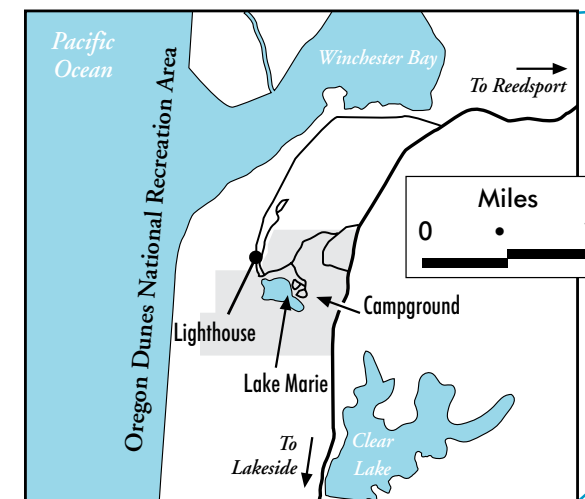

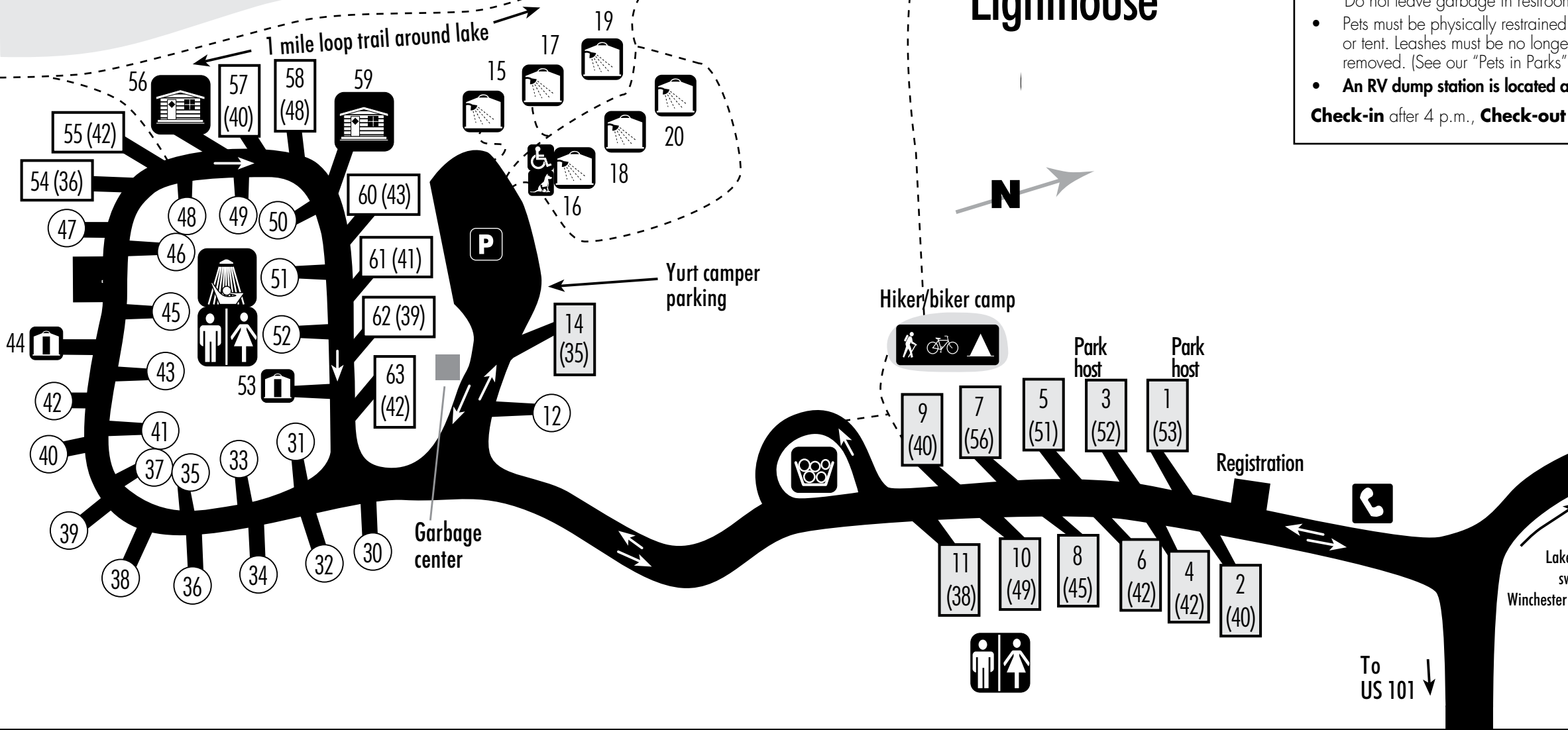

# Umpqua Lighthouse

**Please help make camping a safe and enjoyable experience at both parks by following these and other park rules:**

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved areas only.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but ride them with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Please take all garbage to the dumpsters located near site 12. Do not leave garbage in restroom trash cans or in your campsite.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)
- **An RV dump station is located at William Tugman State Park.**
