### Year-round Amenities

- 121 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water, 36 pull-through)\*
- 89 tent sites with water nearby
- 2 yurts
- 1 deluxe cabin
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Hot showers and flush toilets
- Group tent camping
- RV dump station (Please do not dump into the campsite connection.)
- Laundry facilities

NOTE: D Loop restroom/shower building heated in winter. No water available in full hookup sites B1 and B2 in winter. \*2 sites (E12, E14) are accessible to campers with disabilities.

### Yurts and cabins

The park has two wooden yurts, which are circular, domed structures with carpet, a lockable door, lights and heating and beds with mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three and a futon couch sleeps two. A fire ring and a picnic table are right outside.

Need more room? Our two-story cabin sleeps eight: four upstairs in two bedrooms, and four downstairs on two futon beds. The cabin has a refrigerator, microwave, stove-top burner, electric heat and a bathroom with shower. Dishes, cooking utensils, linen and bedding are not supplied. No pets, smoking or RV hookups are allowed at the cabin or the yurts.

### Discover the Difference

Camping from October 1-April 30 will save you \$4 per night on full hookup and tent sites.

### Day-use

The park has two picnic areas. One is along the lakeshore, with tables and a water fountain accessible to people with disabilities. A boat ramp and marina (with boat, motor and other rentals) are nearby, as is an unsupervised swimming area marked by buoys. The south day-use area offers picnicking between the east and west forks of the Wallowa River.

### Play It Safe

For your own safety, please read and comply with all posted safety rules. Wallowa Memorial Hospital is in Enterprise, 12 miles north. Follow the signs to 401 NE 1st Street.

### An Alpine Experience

Wallowa Lake Village, reminiscent of a Swiss alpine village, offers attractions such as a tramway to the top of 8,200-foot Mt. Howard, with views of Wallowa Lake and the Eagle Cap Wilderness.

### The Eagle Cap Wilderness

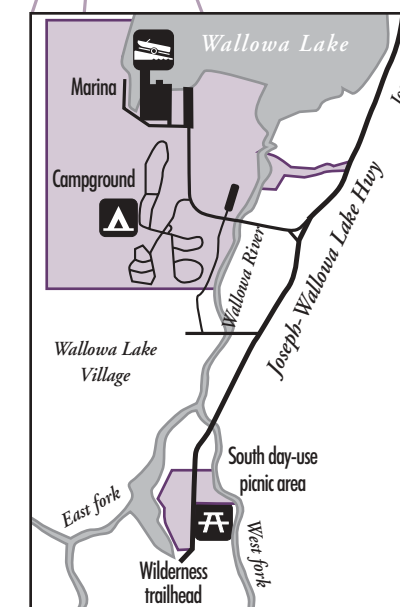
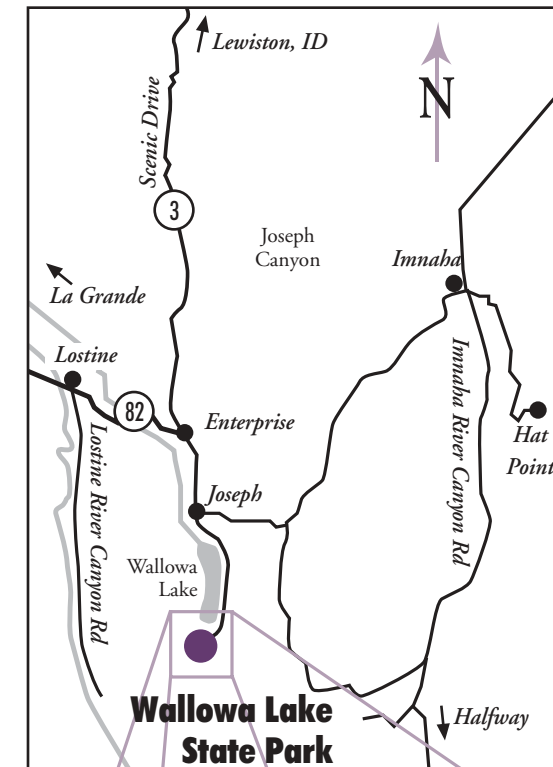
This unspoiled wilderness, with small, sparkling lakes scattered at the base of 10,000-foot peaks, is a paradise for climbers and naturalists. Trails lead up the east and west forks of the Wallowa River from the south day-use picnic area. Information on the wilderness area is available at the U.S. Forest Service ranger station in Enterprise.

### Scenic Auto Routes

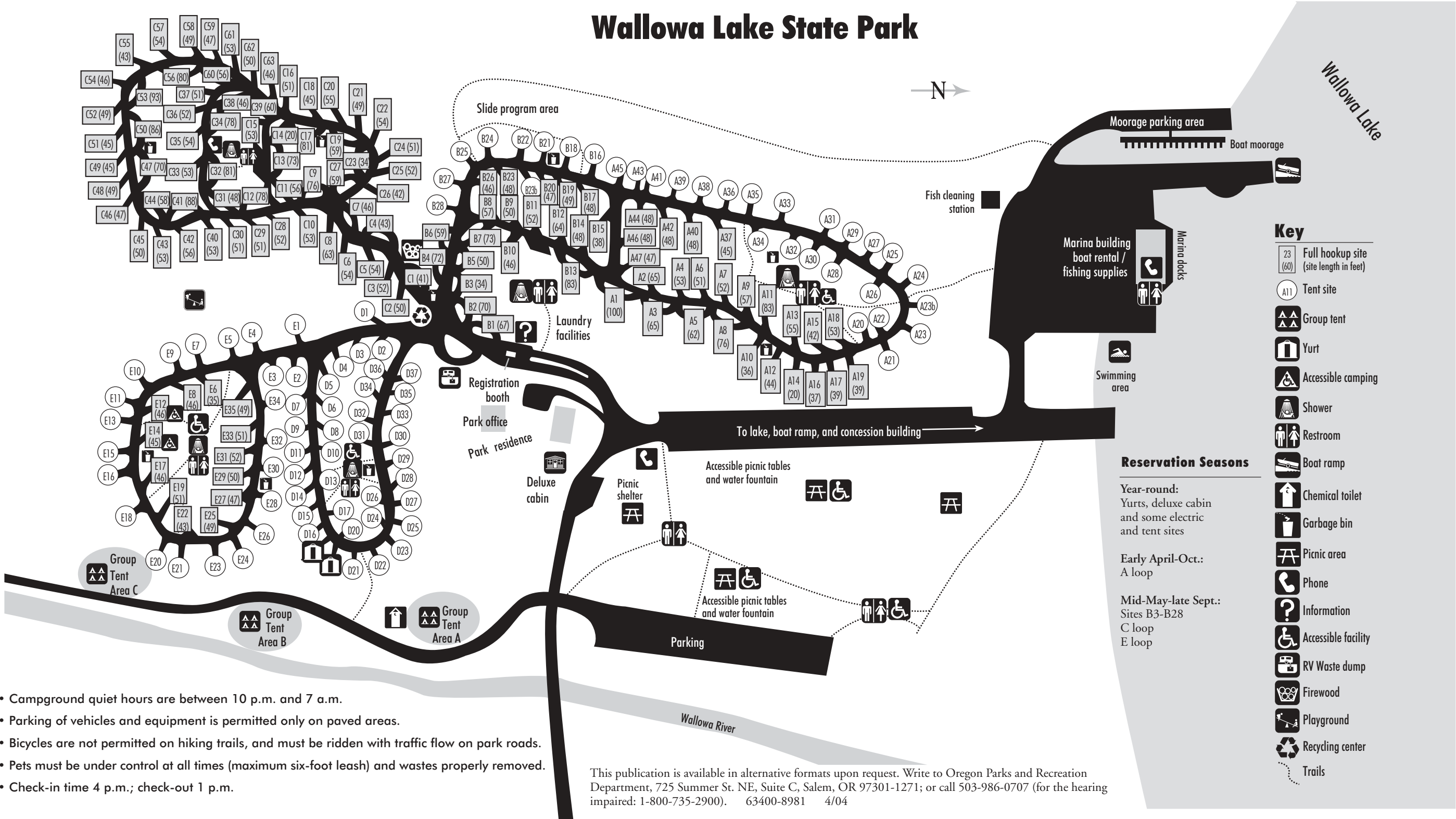
Hat Point viewpoint, 54 miles northeast, overlooks Hell's Canyon on the Snake River. The final 24 miles are on a steep, narrow gravel road. The canyon, a mile deep, is the deepest gorge in North America.

Nearby Joseph Canyon Viewpoint is 30 miles north of Enterprise on Highway 3. Or, head south from Lostine up Lostine River Canyon, and head into the heart of the high country.

**Reservation Seasons**

Year-round:  
Yurts, deluxe cabin and some electric and tent sites

Early April-Oct.:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Parking of vehicles and equipment is permitted only on paved areas.
- Bicycles are not permitted on hiking trails, and must be ridden with traffic flow on park roads.
- Pets must be under control at all times (maximum six-foot leash) and wastes properly removed.
- Check-in time 4 p.m.; check-out 1 p.m.
