Reserve early! Reserve campsites and yurts two days to nine months in advance by phone—Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687)—or online through www.oregonstateparks.org. Group tent areas reservable by calling 1-800-452-5687.

Nestled between the south end of a scenic glacial lake and the towering peaks of the Wallowa Mountains, Wallowa Lake State Recreation Area is ideally positioned as a base camp for both wilderness treks and water sports fun.

Year-Round Camping

- 121 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water, 36 pull-through)
- 89 tent sites with water nearby
- 2 yurts
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Hot showers and flush toilets
- Group tent camping
- RV dump station
- Laundry facilities

NOTE: Only the yurts, some tent sites and some sites with electrical service are open and reservable all year.

Universal Access

Sites E12 and E14 are accessible to campers with disabilities.

Discovery Season

From October 1–April 30, you can rent RV hookup and tent sites at Wallowa Lake for \$4 less than summer rates.

Yurts!

The park has two wooden yurts, which are circular-domed structures with a covered deck and table. A futon couch sleeps two and a bunk bed sleeps two on the bottom bunk and one on the top bunk. Both yurts have lockable doors, lights and heating. Fire pits and picnic tables are right outside. No pets allowed inside, strictly enforced.

Day-Use Amenities

The park has a large day-use area with four reservable locations. All areas include fire pits and ADA picnic tables. **Shoreline** and **Lakeside** have reservable sites near a large open area for sport activities and an unsupervised swim area. A boat launch and marina with boats, motors and other rentals are nearby. **Ice Creek** has a covered reservable shelter with electricity and water. **Riverside** is close to parking and the Wallowa River.

Little Alps day-use area, one mile from the campground, is between the east and west forks of the Wallowa River near the U.S. Forest Service's Wallowa Lake Trailhead.

An Alpine Experience

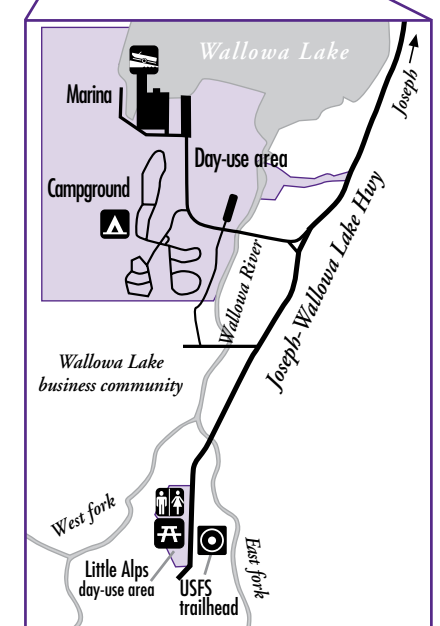
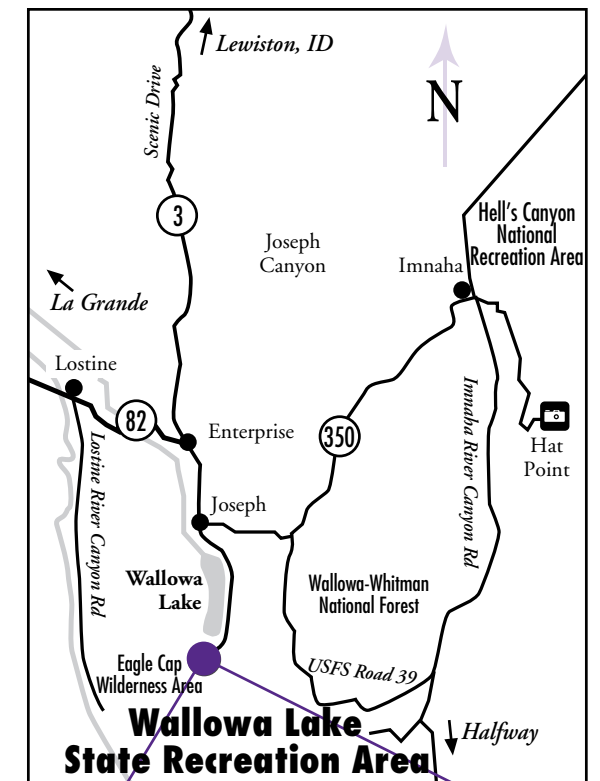
The surrounding community is reminiscent of a Swiss alpine village. It offers attractions such as a tramway to the top of 8,200-foot Mt. Howard, with views of the Wallowa Lake basin, and the Eagle Cap Wilderness. The unspoiled Eagle Cap Wilderness, with small, sparkling lakes scattered at the base of 10,000-foot peaks, is a paradise for hikers, horseback riders and naturalists. Trails lead up the east and west forks of the Wallowa River from the trailhead. Wilderness area information is available at the USFS ranger station in Joseph (541-426-5546).

Hat Point Viewpoint, 54 miles northeast, overlooks the Snake River's mile-deep Hell's Canyon, the deepest gorge in North America. The final 24-mile segment of the gravel road to the viewpoint is steep and narrow.

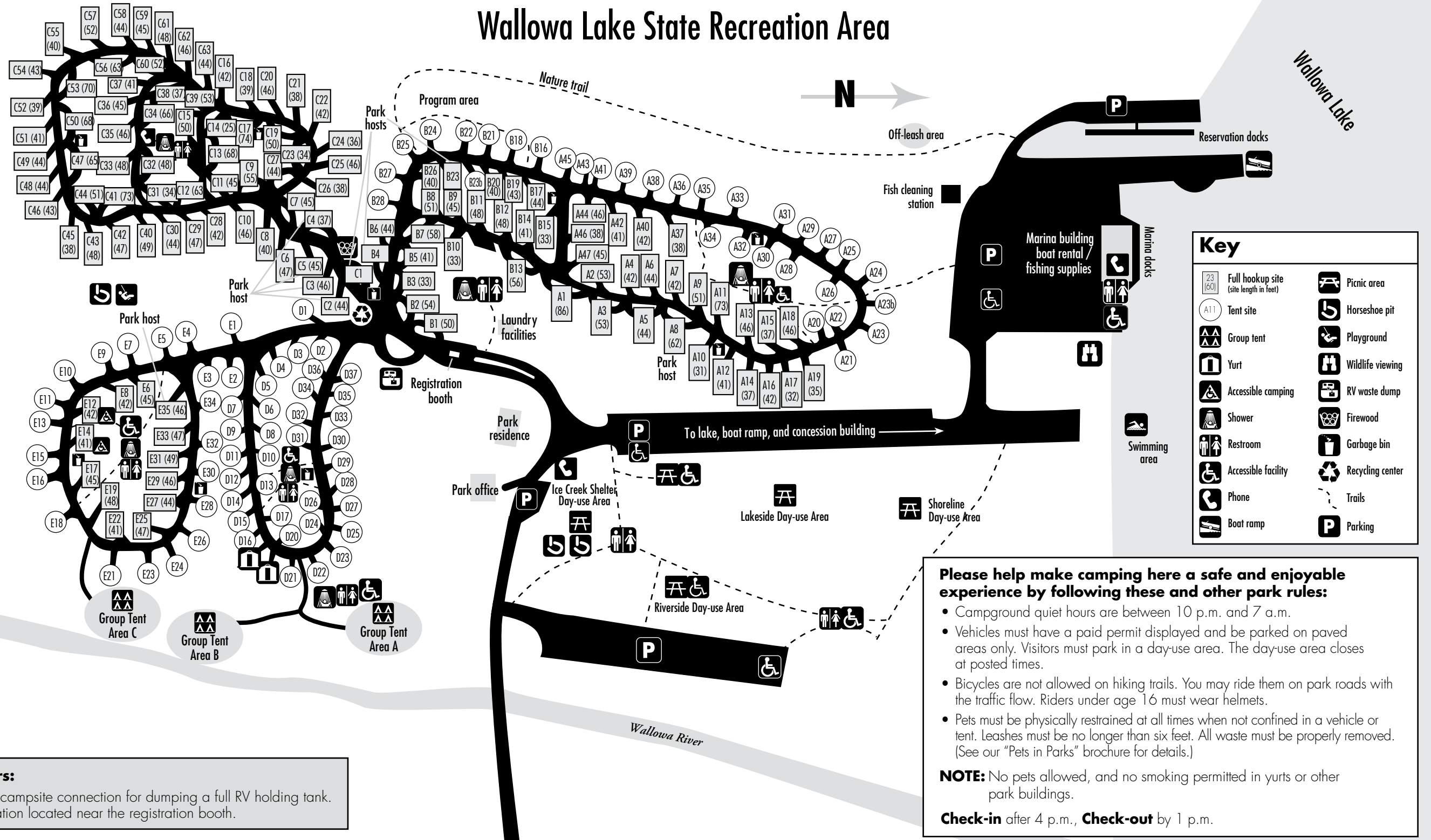
Joseph Canyon Viewpoint is 30 miles north of Enterprise on Highway 3. To the west, you can head up the Lostine River Canyon into the heart of the high country south of Lostine and Highway 82.

ATTENTION RVers:

Please do not use a campsite connection for dumping a full RV holding tank. Use our RV dump station located near the registration booth.

Please help make camping here a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must have a paid permit displayed and be parked on paved areas only. Visitors must park in a day-use area. The day-use area closes at posted times.
- Bicycles are not allowed on hiking trails. You may ride them on park roads with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)

NOTE: No pets allowed, and no smoking permitted in yurts or other park buildings.

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.
